



KS2 children should ideally bring a piece of fruit or an equivalent healthy snack. No crisps or chocolate bars. We encourage children to bring and eat healthy snacks only at break time.

We want to avoid all children eating high fat, high sugar and high salt snacks.


Please ensure your child only brings a healthy snack.



Governance

In a Multi-Academy Trust (MAT) The MAT consists of Members and Directors. The Members are like shareholders and meet once a year. The trustees are responsible for the three core governance functions setting the direction for the schools, holding the CEO & Executive Leadership Team to account and ensuring financial correctness. They meet twice each term, as does the Finance and Standards Committee.



Each school has its own Local Governing Committee (LGC). The Headteacher is a member of the LGC. This group meets approximately each half term. The LGC monitors the work of the school both as a critical friend and also by holding the Headteacher to account for the quality of the education and care provided by the school.





They look at performance data, teaching and learning and monitor School Improvement Plan priorities. Governors visit the school frequently during each term. This allows them to know their school as well as question and evaluate current practice.

Attendance

As you will be aware, a number of years ago the Department of Education removed a Head Teacher's discretion in granting holiday permission for families in term time. For many families, we realise this puts you in a difficult position, but it is recognition of the importance of our children's education. Margaret Gilkes, our Pastoral Lead, and I meet regularly to look at individual children's level of attendance, to spot any patterns that may arise and to arrange meetings with parents to increase attendance where there are any issues. Please remember to complete an 'Exceptional Absence Leave' form (available from the school office) well in advance of needing any exceptional leave. Attendance levels have dropped





nationally since Covid and the government and DfE are focusing on improving this with schools' help. We need your child to be in school every day that they can to keep consistency with their learning. It is so important.

Attendance information

- Parents/Carers are asked to call school to give a reason for their child's absence before 9am if they are poorly.
- Parents/Carers will be called first thing in the morning if a child is absent and we have not been given a reason for this.
- If school have not been given a reason for absence and are unable to get hold of parents/carers, then a home visit will be conducted by school staff on the second day of absence.
- Attendance is monitored and parents will be contacted each half term if attendance is below 95%.
- If attendance falls below 90% parents will be asked to attend a meeting with the Head Teacher and Pastoral Lead.
- The Local Authority Attendance Officer may also attend meetings in school.
- A 6-week plan will be put in place to support families and encourage better attendance.
- Parents may be asked to provide medical evidence from their GP where there are consistent absences.
- If attendance has not improved after the 6 weeks then the Local Authority Attendance Officer will prepare a parenting contract which will be discussed with parents.
- If a child's attendance does not improve after all of the above then the Local Authority can start legal proceedings.

Punctuality

We expect all children to be in school by 8.55am at the latest as the gates will then be locked to secure the site for all children. The classroom doors open at 8.45am. If children haven't arrived to school by this time they will need to go to the front office to register that they are late.

Non-Uniform Friday

This year we will be continuing to run our whole class reward initiative on a Friday as last year. The best whole-class attendance will be rewarded by children coming into school in non-uniform on the Friday of that week – including the teachers! The cycle will run from Friday – Thursday inclusive. If you child's class have achieved this, we will notify you via School email, Dojo and Twitter. There will also be half termly, termly and annual events to





celebrate the children with 100%. **Obviously, children who have regular medical or other appointments will have these excluded from their 100% tally. More information to follow.

Boomerang is fully inclusive and supports children with special educational needs as well as those who speak English as an additional language. Boomerang meets the needs of the children extremely well and staff are able to identify any needs within the provision and adapt where necessary. The staff are fully qualified and update their skills through regular training. There is close communication between the Boomerang staff and the rest of the school staff to ensure no messages or information gets lost between different parts of the school day. Boomerang understands the pressures that are put on parents/ carers with different working patterns and tries hard to accommodate flexible requests where possible.

School Uniform 2023-2024

Uniform Shop

We have an on-site uniform shop where good quality pre-loved items have been donated to school. This is available to all pupils regardless of need. The uniform shop is open every school day and a donation can be paid to the school office for these items. There is no barrier to wearing the Clifford Bridge Academy uniform and Disadvantaged pupils and their families are supported financially as required. Any family requiring support should seek this through the Pastoral Team in the first instance.

Make-up	No make-up, nail varnish or acrylic nails are allowed.	
Hairstyles	Hair should be of a natural colour. Hair must be tied back in practical lessons for Health and Safety reasons. Hair must be kept out of children's eyes, using hairbands, small clips and hair slides – plain and in school colours (red, white, black or grey) Hair accessories should be minimal, plain and in school colours (red, white, black or grey).	
Bags	School bookbags are encouraged. If pupils use a bag, it must be appropriately sized. It should hold children's books and reading diaries comfortably without causing any damage. Large bags/large rucksacks are not permitted for due to space on children's pegs. Bags featuring inappropriate images, slogans or phrases are not permitted. The school encourages pupils to bring non-valuable bags to school. The school will not be liable for lost or damaged school bags.

Inclusion



SEND at Clifford Bridge Academy

Not every child finds learning easy all the time. At Clifford Bridge Academy we understand that effective provision for pupils with Special Educational Needs is vital to ensure all children reach their full academic and social & emotional potential. The SEN Code of Practice (2014) describes a child or young person as having SEN if they have a learning difficulty or disability, which calls for special educational provision to be made for him or her.

A person has a learning difficulty if he or she:

- Has significantly greater difficulty in learning than the majority of others of the same age, or
- Has a disability which prevents or hinders them from making use of educational facilities of a kind generally provided for others of the same age in mainstream schools.

Inspire Challenge Awards



- •Homework has been a contentious issue with parents for many years.
- •Should homework be banned? Is homework at primary school necessary? Do pupils receive enough education in class that homework is nothing but a waste of time? How do you consolidate skills and keep standards high?
- •This issue raises strong opinions in teachers, parents, school leaders, governors and the wider public.
- •The DfE launched its Activity Passport in January 2019 which was inspired by the National Trust 50 Things to do before you are 11³/₄ and supported by a range of organisations. However, some of the activities included in the passport weren't in line with the Inspire curriculum.

We launched the Inspire Challenge Awards

Every child from Reception to year 6 has a set of 30 bespoke challenges to achieve throughout the academic year. These challenges are carefully planned to match with the Inspire Education Trust curriculum and ensure children are getting the experiences and opportunities that are their right as a child. Each challenge has been designed to make sure that all families can achieve these without impacting financially (school can support if you are struggling and we have ideas and ways to help). It ensures that children aren't stuck indoors on electronic devices and are getting out and about in the community and local area, keeping active and getting in touch with nature.





In order to develop a growth mindset, essential for future success, children are given a range of opportunities to try new things and maybe find a skill or talent they didn't know they had!

Teachers regularly check the booklets for children achieving challenges and there is space for you to record special moment or pride in your own child's achievements.

At the end of the summer term, there is a grand award ceremony for all children who have achieved all their challenges or tried very hard to complete them all.


















MY ACHIEVEMENTS


